#### GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- Playing in their first overtime game of the season, the Thunder limited the Trail Blazers to 1-of-9 field goal shooting (11.1%) in the overtime period to improve to 4-1 in games played immediately after a loss this year. Last season, the Thunder matched an all-time NBA record by recording eight overtime wins during the course of the year.
- Despite trailing 101-95 with just over two minutes left in regulation, the Thunder forced overtime after a key Kevin Durant corner 3-point field goal followed by three free throws from Russell Westbrook. On the Thunder's final offensive possession in the fourth quarter, Durant brought the Thunder even with the Trail Blazers after a goaltending call was made on his driving lay-up. Russell Westbrook would block Nicolas Batum's shot on the Blazers final possession to force overtime.
- Although LaMarcus Aldridge recorded a game-high 39 points in 44 minutes, he was held without a field goal (0-3 FGs) in overtime.
- Oklahoma City recorded season-high 59 rebounds while limiting Portland to 20 fewer rebounds. On the season OKC is 10-1 when outrebounding the opponent and a perfect 5-0 when outrebounding the opposition by 10 or more.
- The Thunder became just the second team to defeat the Blazers at the Rose Garden this season (POR 11-1 at home entering game vs. OKC).

#### GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- Despite six Thunder players scoring in double-figures for the first time this year, Tony Parker set a season-high with 42 points (16-29 FGs) as the Spurs defeated the Thunder to improve to a NBA-leading 13-1 at home this season.
- The Thunder deficit ballooned to as many as 24 points in the third quarter (largest deficit at any point this season for OKC) and in the fourth quarter, the Thunder trimmed the Spurs lead to nine points with 8:27 left in regulation, but San Antonio quickly scored six unanswered points to push their lead to 99-84 with less than six minutes remaining.
- Kevin Durant matched a career-long streak after recording a fifth consecutive double-double with a team-high 22 points and 11 rebounds.
- The Thunder reserves provided a lift for Oklahoma City late in the third period and early in the fourth quarter. James Harden (19 points; 5-10 FGs) and Reggie Jackson (10 points; 4-7 FGs) each came off the Thunder bench to score in double figures.
- San Antonio was effective shooting the ball from long range. After shooting 9-of-12 from 3-point range in the first half (69.2%), three Spurs players finished the night with three made 3-point field goals (Bonner, Jefferson and Leonard)
- With nine assists to go along with his season-high 42 points, Tony Parker passed Avery Johnson to become the Spurs All-Time assists leader.

#### GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- After trailing by as many as 10 points in the final minute of the third period, the Thunder staged a fourth quarter comeback in which they outscored Memphis 32-17 to capture a sixth consecutive home victory. In the fourth quarter, Oklahoma City shot 61.1% (11-18 FGs) while limiting Memphis to 27.8% shooting (5-18 FGs).
- With the score deadlocked at 94-94 with 1:12 left in regulation, Kevin Durant responded by scoring on the Thunder's final three possessions. Including his 3-point field goal which put the Thunder ahead for good at 97-94 with 54 seconds left in the game, Durant scored 16 (5-7 FGs) on his game-high 36 points in the final period.
- James Harden came off the Thunder bench and matched a season-high as he single-handedly outscored the Memphis reserves by a 24-15 margin. In the fourth quarter Harden scored 10 points after shooting 4-of-5 from the field including 2-of-3 3-point shooting. OKC is 8-1 this season when their bench outscored the opposing reserves.
- Despite getting outscored in the paint 50-38, the Thunder team recorded 12 blocked shots as Kevin Durant, Serge Ibaka and Daequan Cook each recorded three blocked shots. On the season, OKC is a perfect 6-0 when registering 10-plus blocks.

## OKLAHOMA CITY THUNDER NOTES

**So Far, So Good:** After last night's victory over the Trail Blazers in Portland, the Thunder enters tonight's contest against the Warriors as winners of 14 of their last 17 outings. With a record of 19-5, the Thunder continues to maintain the best record in the NBA. Through the first 24 games of the season, Oklahoma City is tied for its second best start in franchise history (the OKC franchise also opened the 2004-05 season 19-5). Only the 1993-94 team (21-3) posted a better record through the first 24 games of the season.

**Awfully Good in OT:** Last night, the Thunder prevailed in their very first overtime game of the 2011-12 season after limiting Portland to 1-of-9 shooting (11.1%) in the overtime period. Last season, the Thunder became just the FIFTH team in NBA history to win eight overtime games in a single season (8-2). OKC set an all-time franchise record by winning five straight overtime games to start the season and the club's eight OT wins are the most in the NBA since 2002, when the Detroit Pistons went 8-0 in their overtime contests. During the 2010-11 season, OKC captured the franchises' first-ever triple-overtime victory (12/1/10) against New Jersey (OKC franchise was previously 0-4 all-time in triple overtime games).

**Just Another Back-2-Back:** Tonight, Oklahoma City will face the Warriors at the ORACLE Arena while playing on the second night of a back-to-back. With 18 sets of back-to-backs scheduled (in addition to the Thunder's back-to-back-to-back) for the Thunder during the 2011-12 season, Oklahoma City has been successful to this point when playing on consecutive nights. So far this season, the Thunder has already registered sweeps in three sets of back-to-back match-ups to go along with a sweep of the team's lone back-to-back-to-back. So far this season, Oklahoma City is 6-1 on the first night and 5-2 on the second or third night of a back-to-back. Last season the Thunder played 17 sets of back-to-backs and the club posted a 13-4 record on the first night followed by a 10-7 mark on the second night. During the 2010-11 season, OKC captured sweeps in seven of their back-to-back pairings.

**Road Warriors:** Through the first two months of the 2011-12 season, the Thunder has once again found success playing on the road. In 14 games played away from the Chesapeake Energy Arena, the Thunder has registered a NBA-best 10-4 mark on the road. The Thunder is currently one of only four Western Conference teams (Denver, Minnesota and the L.A. Clippers) to boast a winning road record. To put a bit more perspective on the Thunder's road success, Oklahoma City has recorded at least twice as many road victories as any team in the Southwest or Pacific divisions. Last year, the Thunder recorded a mark of 25-16 on the road. Only four other teams tallied more road victories than the Thunder (CHI, MIA, DAL and LAL).

**Bouncing Back:** Dating back to the start of last season, Oklahoma City has demonstrated a high level of resiliency in those games played immediately after a loss. After last night's overtime victory over the Trail Blazers, OKC is currently 4-1 this season in games played after a loss. This comes on the heels of the 2010-11 season in which Oklahoma City posted a record of 20-6 in games played immediately after a loss. The Thunder's .769 winning percentage in those games played after a defeat was trumped by only the Chicago Bulls last season (Chicago 16-4 following a loss).

**Double-Double Man:** Although Kevin Durant was unable to register a double-double last night in Portland, he did record a career-long (tying) streak of five straight games with a double-double entering last night's contest (1/27 at GS -2/4 at SA). Last season, Durant recorded 14 double-doubles including a stretch of five consecutive double-doubles from 1/30/11 vs. Miami - 2/8/11 vs. Memphis. During the 2011-12 season, Durant has increased his rebounding average by a full 1.5 rebounds per game (averaging a team-high 8.3 rebounds this season) and with 10 double-doubles entering tonight's game in Oakland, he is only 4 double-doubles shy of reaching last year's total for the entire season.

**Getting Defensive:** Including the Thunder's recent outing against the Mavericks (2/1), Oklahoma City has held eight opponents to less than 40.0% shooting this year, while posting a 7-1 record in those games. Last season, the Thunder was only able to accomplish such a feat on six occasions (The Thunder went 6-0 in those contests). In 24 games this year the Thunder is limiting their opponent to 95.6 points on 42.2% shooting. Through the first 24 games of last season (in which OKC started 16-8), the Thunder surrendered 102.9 points on 46.9% shooting.

**One More Defensive Nugget:** Prior to last Monday's game against the Los Angeles Clippers (1/30), the Thunder had not allowed a single opponent (through 19 games) to shoot 50.0% or better all season. Before allowing the Clippers to shoot 56.3% from the field, the Thunder had been one of only two teams yet to allow an opponent to shoot 50.0% (Toronto Raptors). The Clippers remain the only team to shoot 50.0% or better against Oklahoma City this season (last year, OKC opponents shot 50.0% or better on 17 occasions).

**Russell Rules:** With averages of 21.9 points, 5.8 assists and 5.0 rebounds, Russell Westbrook joins Kobe Bryant and LeBron James as the only other players in the NBA this season to average 20+ points, 5+ assists and 5+ rebounds. Including a career-long seven game streak (1/10 at MEM - 1/23 vs. DET), Russell Westbrook has scored 20-plus points in 12 of the Thunder's last 14 outings. Westbrook recently received the NBA's Western Conference Player of the Week honors after leading Oklahoma City to a 3-0 mark for the week ending, January 29<sup>th</sup> (last season, Westbrook was named Player of the Week on five occasions). After starting the 2011-12 season scoring 17.3 points on 41.1% shooting through the first 10 games of the season, Westbrook has proceeded to average 25.2 points on 47.8% shooting in the last 14 games. During Westbrook's first three full seasons in the NBA, he became one of only five players in NBA history to record 4,000 points, 1,500 assists and 1,000 rebounds through three NBA seasons (Chris Paul, LeBron James, Anfernee Hardaway and Oscar Robertson). By averaging better than 21+ points and 8+ assists last season, Westbrook became just the FIFTH player in the last 15 years to average 21+ points and 8+ assists {Gary Payton (4x), Stephon Marbury (4x), Chris Paul (2x) and LeBron James). During the season, 61.0% of Westbrook's field goal attempts were taken from inside the paint (tops among all NBA guards; min. 500 FG attempts).

**Dynamic Duo:** The Thunder fell to the Clippers last week despite receiving a 30-point performance from both Kevin Durant and Russell Westbrook. Last season, the Thunder went a perfect 5-0 when the pair each scored 30 or more points. During the Thunder's victory over the Warriors in Oakland late last month (1/27) both Russell Westbrook and Kevin Durant proceeded to score at least 25 points. It's was the 36<sup>th</sup> time in their four seasons as teammates that each Durant and Westbrook scored at least 25 points in the same game. No other teammates in NBA history have even had 25 games of each scoring 25 points before turning 24 years old. By combining for 49.6 points per game last season, the Durant-Westbrook tandem finished second to only LeBron James and Dwayne Wade (combined for 52.2 ppg) of the Miami Heat in the race for the NBA's highest scoring duo. During the 2010-11 season, Russell Westbrook assisted on 279 of Durant's made field goals (tops in the NBA from one teammate to another). In fact, Westbrook assisted on 24.0% more assists to Durant than the next highest NBA duo (Chris Paul registered 212 assists to David West).

**All-Star Bound:** Kevin Durant was named a starter on the 2012 Western Conference All-Star team after receiving 1,345,566 votes, second most in the Western Conference, the NBA announced earlier this week. This will mark Durant's third career All-Star appearance and his second as a starter. During last year's game played at STAPLES Center in Los Angeles, Durant was the game's second leading scorer after recording 34 points to go along with three rebounds and two assists in 30 minutes. The 2012 NBA All-Star Game, which will air live at 8 p.m. ET on TNT and ESPN Radio in the U.S., and reach fans in more than 200 countries and territories in more than 40 languages, will be played at Amway Center in Orlando – on Sunday, Feb. 26, 2012.

**Team USA:** On January 16<sup>th</sup> Kevin Durant and Russell Westbrook were among the 20 finalists named for the 2012 U.S. Olympic men's basketball team. Durant was named World Championship MVP during the 2010 USA World Championships after helping lead team USA to a perfect 9-0 record and a gold medal in Istanbul, Turkey. His involvement in USA basketball began in 2006 when he was named a member of the U.S. team at the Nike Hoop Summit. Westbrook, was also a member of the 2010 USA World Championship team and his involvement with USA Basketball dates back to 2008 when he was named to the USA Basketball Select team. The official 12-man U.S. Olympic team roster will be announced later this year

**Block Party:** On February 1st, Serge Ibaka matched an all-time franchise record by recording 10 blocked shots in 40 minutes against the Mavericks. After a four-block effort in the Thunder's most recent outing at Portland, Oklahoma City is now a perfect 11-0 this season when Ibaka blocks three or more shots. Through the Thunder's first 17 games this season both Serge Ibaka and Kendrick Perkins recorded a blocked shot in EVERY game (Oklahoma City was the only NBA team to feature two players with a block in every game through 17 games). Prior to the Thunder's game against Golden State (1/27), Ibaka had blocked a shot in 31 consecutive contests (longest such streak in the NBA at that time) dating back to last season. During the 2010-11 season, Ibaka strung together an impressive 26 game streak in which he recorded at least a single blocked shot. With a blocked shot in the first 17 games of this season Kendrick Perkins now owns a new career-best streak (previous career-high was 13 straight games with a block).

**Boards are the Barometer:** As one might expect, Oklahoma City has traditionally found their greatest success when outrebounding the opposition. After outrebounding the Trail Blazers 59-39 on February 6th, the Thunder improved to 10-1 this season when outrebounding the opposition (5-0 when outrebounding the opponent by 10 or more). Last season, OKC registered a 37-11 mark when outrebounding their opponent. During the 2009-10 season, the Thunder finished the regular season ranked 3<sup>rd</sup> in the NBA in rebounding. When digging deeper, the Thunder outrebounded their opponent in 55 of 82 games. In those contests, OKC posted a 40-15 record. Meanwhile, the Thunder went just 10-17 when they failed to rebound their opposition.

**Harden Heats Up:** James Harden has once again continued to impact games for the Thunder in a reserve capacity early in the 2011-12 season. Harden has come off the bench in 22 of 24 games this season for Oklahoma City and in all but two instances he has proceeded to score in double figures (including seven 20-point efforts in which the team is 6-1). Harden's 16.7 point per game average is currently tops in the NBA among reserves (min. 15 games). Including his career-best 18 game streak (2/15-3/25) James Harden came off the Thunder bench to score in double figures in 27 of the final 29 games of the 2010-11 regular season. After the All-Star break, Harden averaged 15.8 points per game while shooting 46.5% from the field. From February 22<sup>nd</sup> to the end of the 2010-11 season, Harden led the NBA in bench scoring (15.8 ppg).

**Making them Look Free:** After a lackluster free throw shooting display in their four outings prior to last night's game in Portland (82-117 FTs; 70.1%), the Thunder has dropped out of the top spot and now ranks third in the NBA in free throw shooting accuracy (79.1%). Last season, OKC shot a league-best 82.3% from the free throw line (5<sup>th</sup> highest percentage in NBA history). As a point of reference, the best all-time free throw shooting percentage for an entire season in NBA history is 83.2% (Boston Celtics; 1989-90). Additionally, OKC led the NBA in free throw makes (24.1) and ranked second in free throw attempts (29.3) per game. On the year, OKC converted 30+ FTs on eighteen occasions (16-2 record) after doing so six times during all of the 2009-10 season (4-2 record). During the 2009-10 season Durant recorded 756 free throw makes, an all-time OKC Thunder franchise record and the 6<sup>th</sup> most in NBA history for a single season. Durant's 756 free throws made were the most for a single-season since Michael Jordan recorded 833 free throw makes during the 1986-87 season. KD is the ONLY player in NBA history to convert 700+ free throws while shooting 90.0% or better.

**Feasting on the East:** Picking up right where they left-off last season, the Thunder has once again found a high-level of success when taking-on Eastern Conference opponents. Oklahoma City improved to 5-1 against teams from "The East" after defeating the Detroit Pistons by 20 points on January 23<sup>rd</sup>. Last season, the Thunder found a high degree of success when facing opponents from the "East." Oklahoma City concluded the season with a record of 22-8 when facing Eastern Conference foes. The Thunder's .733 winning percentage vs. the Eastern Conference ranked tied with Dallas for second best (San Antonio; 23-7) among all Western Conference teams. After defeating the Bobcats by 17 points on 2/18/11, OKC completed "sweeps" against eight Eastern Conference teams last season (CHA, WAS, DET, PHI, IND, NJ, ATL and CLE).

**Tracking the Perk Effect:** Since Kendrick Perkins made his Oklahoma City debut last season on 3/14/11 at Washington, the Thunder has posted a 32-9 record. With Perkins in the lineup for the final 17 games of the 2010-11 regular season, the Thunder held its opponents to an average of 97.9 points on 43.8% shooting. Prior to Perkins joining the team mid-season, the Thunder had been allowing 101.8 points on 46.3% shooting. Since the trade deadline last season, OKC has posted a 37-10 record with either Nazr Mohammed or Kendrick Perkins in the starting lineup.

**OKC is Fan Friendly:** The Thunder opened the 2011-12 season right where they left off a year ago...with another sellout. So far this season the Thunder has recorded sellouts in all ten of their home games. This occurs on the heels of the 2010-11 season in which the Thunder sold out 14 consecutive games to close the regular season and 35 games overall. With an average attendance of 18,148, Thunder fans filled the Chesapeake Energy Arena to 99.9% capacity last season. Those in attendance this year will once again enjoy the improvements made to the Chesapeake Energy Arena as part of a taxpayer funded initiative passed in March 2008. Thanks to the publically funded initiative, the team's arena boasts a state-of-the-art scoreboard, new terrace suites, an updated main concourse with new concession stands to go with a high-end courtside club.

**30 Never Looked so Good:** Picking up right where he left off last season, Kevin Durant hit the 30-point scoring mark in each of the Thunder's first four games this season. Durant is one of only four players in the last 30 years to open the season with four straight 30-point scoring efforts (Most recent: Kobe Bryant in 2005-06). In the last four seasons, Durant has scored 30+ points in 105 games (most in the NBA). Most importantly for Oklahoma City, the Thunder has found a great deal of success on Durant's biggest nights. Dating back to the start of the 2010-11 season the Thunder has posted a 31-7 record when Durant hits the 30-point plateau. During the 2009-10 season, Durant set a franchise record by scoring 30+ points on 47 occasions.

**Sweep Success:** After defeating the San Antonio Spurs earlier this season (1/8), the Thunder claimed a "sweep" in the team's lone back-to-back-to-back of the season. Oklahoma City defeated the Houston Rockets on consecutive nights before knocking-off the Spurs to become the first team to sweep a back-to-back-to-back in the NBA this season (OKC was the sixth team to play three games in three nights this season). During the 1998-99 season there were 64 back-to-back-to-backs played and of those, there were only eight sweeps.

**Five-In-Seven:** After defeating the Phoenix Suns at the end of 2011 (12/31), Oklahoma City claimed their fifth victory of the season in the first seven days of the 2011-12 season. The Thunder became just the second team in NBA history to capture five wins in the first seven days of the season (Houston Rockets accomplished the feat to start the 1996-97 season). The 5-0 start for the Thunder this year was the best start for the OKC franchise since the 1998-99 season.

**Game Winner for KD:** During the Thunder's game on December 29<sup>th</sup> versus Dallas, Kevin Durant kept Oklahoma City a perfect 4-0 with his game-winning 3-point field goal at the buzzer. Durant's game-winner against the Mavs represented Durant's third such game-winning field goal of his career (Durant's other buzzer-beater shots occurred on 11/16/07 against Atlanta and 1/22/2011 versus New York).

**Happy New Year:** The Thunder closed-out 2011 with a 10-point victory over the Phoenix Suns in front of their home crowd at the Chesapeake Energy Arena. In each of the last four seasons, Oklahoma City has played a home affair on New Year's Eve and in each instance, the Thunder has prevailed (OKC defeated Phoenix, Atlanta, Utah and Golden State in each of the last four seasons on New Year's Eve).

**Minnesota Mystery:** With the Thunder's 104-100 victory over the T-Wolves during the first week of the season, Oklahoma City has now won 10 consecutive contests versus Minnesota. The OKC franchise had not won 10-plus games against a single franchise since securing 14 straight wins against the Warriors (November 1999 to January 2003).

**A Merry Christmas for OKC Indeed:** In the season opener for the Thunder, Oklahoma City provided its fans with a gift in the form of a 97-89 victory over the Orlando Magic on Christmas Night. The Thunder secured a Christmas win for a second consecutive season thanks in large part to a defensive effort that limited Orlando to 37.0% shooting {OKC limited ORL to 30.5% shooting (22-72 FGs) after the Magic made eight of their first nine field goals to start the game). OKC held the Magic to sub 40.0% shooting on the night – a feat they only achieved six times during the 2010-11 season (OKC was a perfect 6-0 in those game last season and is currently 2-0 this season). The OKC franchise now maintains a two-game Christmas win streak after going winless in their first 11 Christmas appearances.

**Western Conference Finals:** Last season, the Oklahoma City Thunder appeared in the Western Conference Finals just two years after finishing the 2008-09 season with a record of 23-59 (started season 3-29). Since the NBA went to a conference format in 1970-71, only one other team has reached the conference finals within two years after winning 23 or fewer games {San Antonio; 1998-99 season (won 20 games in 1996-97)}. The Thunder concluded the 2009-10 season by compiling 50 wins after posting just 23 victories during the team's inaugural season in Oklahoma City. The 27 win improvement was tied for the EIGHTH largest increase in NBA history.

**Northwest Division Champions:** After knocking-off the Los Angeles Clippers on April 6<sup>th</sup> of last season, the Thunder became the 2010-11 Northwest Division Champions. Oklahoma City concluded the 2010-11 regular season by winning sixteen of their final twenty games of the year. Dating back to March 9<sup>th</sup>, only the Chicago Bulls (18-2) and Miami (15-3) posted a better record than the Thunder. During the five-week long run, Oklahoma City averaged 105.3 points on 47.4% shooting while limiting the opposition to an average of 97.0 points on 43.4% field goal shooting. Additionally, OKC ranked second in the league in blocked shots (7.0 per game) and fourth in steals (8.8 per game) during this 20-game span.

**National Spotlight:** Oklahoma City is currently slated to appear on ESPN, ABC or TNT 17 times throughout the course of the 2011-12 season. Additionally, the Thunder is set to be featured on NBATV eight times this upcoming season. When the dust settled on the NBA's 2011-12 broadcasting schedule, the Thunder was set to make the 6th most national TV dates this year. OKC is currently 8-1 on national television this year (OKC started the 2010-11 season by going a perfect 7-0 on national TV). Including the Thunder's 99-90 victory over Portland Trail Blazers on 3/27/11, the Thunder posted a 9-6 record during their 15 nationally television appearances last season.

**Back-to-Back Scoring Champ:** With his 27.7 point per game scoring clip last season Kevin Durant became just the 11<sup>th</sup> player in NBA history to win back-to-back scoring titles. Durant is the most recent player to accomplish the feat since Kobe Bryant won consecutive scoring titles in 2005-06 and 2006-07. By capturing back-to-back scoring crowns, Durant has joined a hall-of-fame list of current and former NBA players who have won consecutive scoring titles (Kobe Bryant, Tracy McGrady, Allen Iverson, Michael Jordan, George Gervin, Bob McAdoo, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Wilt Chamberlain, Neil Johnston and George Mikan). Should Durant capture a scoring title this season, he would become the first player to claim three straight scoring crowns since Michael Jordan (1995-1998). During the 2009-10 season, Durant became the youngest scoring champion in NBA history (21 years and 197 days). The previous record was held by Max Zaslofsky of the Chicago Stags (22 years and 105 days) in 1947-48, when the scoring champion was determined by total points scored.

**Inserting Ibaka:** When the dust settled on the 2010-11 season, Serge Ibaka registered the most blocks in the NBA (198). Ibaka's 2.4 blocks per game average ranked 3<sup>rd</sup> in the league and earlier in the 2010-11 season, he posted a blocked shot in 26 consecutive games (longest streak at that time in NBA). On the season, Ibaka blocked four or more shots on 18 occasions and the Thunder posted a 16-2 record in those games. Dating back to the start of last season, Ibaka has started 68 games for the Thunder and the team has posted a 51-17 record in those contests.
